

1. <b>Bartolomeu dias</b>	Portuguese explorer who in 1488 led the first expedition to sail around the southern tip of Africa from the Atlantic and sight the Indian Ocean.
2. <b>Colony</b>	A group of people in one place who are ruled by a parent country elsewhere.
3. <b>Conquest</b>	Capture or taking of something by force
4. <b>Epidemic</b>	A widespread outbreak of an infectious disease.
5. <b>Global</b>	Actions or processes that involve the entire world and result in making something worldwide in scope.
6. <b>Henry Hudson</b>	Discovered what today is known as the Hudson River. Sailed for the Dutch even though he was originally from England. He was looking for a northwest passage through North America.
7. <b>Impact</b>	an effect or result
8. <b>Imperialism</b>	when a stronger nation takes over a weaker nation
9. <b>Interdependence</b>	A relationship between countries in which they rely on one another for resources, goods, or services
10. <b>Jacques Cartier</b>	sponsored by King Francis to find a shorter water route to China
11. <b>James Cook</b>	A navigator and ship captain who explored and claimed land in Australia for England
12. <b>Missionary</b>	A person who spreads his or her religious beliefs to others
13. <b>Pandemic</b>	an epidemic that is geographically widespread
14. <b>Racism</b>	Belief that one race is superior to another
15. <b>Route</b>	A defined plan for travel
16. <b>Sir Francis Drake</b>	1st Englishmen to circumnavigate the globe
17. <b>Vasco Nunez de Balboa</b>	Spanish explorer who discovered the Pacific Ocean (1475-1519)
18. <b>Vitus Bering</b>	Danish explorer who explored the northern Pacific Ocean for the Russians and discovered the Bering Strait (1681-1741)
